Secondary 2 Music aims to continue on basic musical instrumental and theoretical concepts taught in secondary 1. Students will continue performing on instruments as well as develop other musical competencies.

Musical Competencies:

- To create
 - Uses ideas to create & organize a musical composition
 - Uses elements of musical language and elements of technique
- To perform
 - Becomes familiar with the musical content of pieces of music
 - Applies elements of instrumental technique
 - Becomes familiar with the expressive nature of a piece of music
 - Respects group ensemble performance conventions
- To appreciate
 - Analyzes & interprets a musical work or production
 - Makes a critical and aesthetic judgment of music selections

Course Content:

<u>Continuation of Foundations of Musical Instrument</u> Performance:

- Posture, holding and hand position
- Breath control and tone production
- Articulation & Dynamics
- Development of further pitch range
- Tempo & Indications

Analysis—Students will examine:

- Performances of themselves and others (written and orally)
- Interpretation of musical creations

Course Materials:

- Standard of Excellence—Band Method Book
- Alfred's Essentials of Music Theory-Workbook provided to each student
- Sheet music—variety of songs

Theory-Elements of the Language of Music:

- Treble and bass clefs
- Simple Meters
- Basic and dotted rhythms
- More complex rhythmic combinations
- Note names and accidentals
- Compositional Techniques

Historical Components:

 Identification & study of different historical periods & styles (classical, modern, jazz, baroque, popular, etc.)



- Staff paper, lined paper, pencil, eraser
- Instrument, mouthpiece, reed (if required)
- Please keep a binder or folder for music given out in class and work done in class

In this course, you will be required to hand in practice logs as proof of individual practice. You are required to practice at least TWICE per week for 20-30 minutes each. The log will include the date and items practiced—be specific! Include method book activity numbers, song names, techniques etc. Practice is to be completed OUTSIDE of class time at home, during lunch or before/after school in the music room.

Signing Out Instruments:

Students will each be assigned a specific instrument that they will be using for the entire term. After this point, students are encouraged to take instruments home in the evening or on weekends to practice. Essentially, this will be students' 'homework' in music class!! Instruments can be signed out of the music room at the end of each day and MUST be returned before Period 1 each morning. Once an instrument is signed out to a student, it becomes their responsibility. All instruments belong to the school and can be expensive to repair or replace. Please see Instrument Policy for more details.

Music Class Rules

- RESPECT!!!! Respect each other, Ms. Rigden, and property that belongs to the school!
- Arrive on time and PREPARED! You should be ready to start class with you instrument set up once the bell rings!
- Classroom expectations:
 - 1. **DO NOT** interrupt anyone, including the teacher, in class while they are speaking. This includes playing your instrument, talking to a neighbour, or speaking out loud.
 - 2. **DO NOT** negatively comment on anyone or anything in the class. "If you don't have anything nice to say, don't say it at all!"
 - 3. This is a classroom of **mutual respect and learning**. I am more than happy to hear your questions, comments and concerns **AT THE APPROPRIATE TIME**.
- CLEAN UP AFTER YOURSELF!!!!!
- No DRINKS or FOOD! Only water bottles will be permitted...

Grade 8 Music Practice Log

It is the expectation in Grade 8 Music that you are completing individual practice outside of class on your instrument. Given that homework is not regularly assigned, practicing your instrument is considered you "homework" in Music. You should be practicing at least 2 times per week for approximately 20-30 minutes each.

What to Practice?

- Review notes and rhythms
- Scales
- Songs
- Red Method Book exercises (work ahead of what we are playing in class)

If you cannot practice at home, you should be coming in at lunch time or before/after school to do some practicing in the music room. "I cannot take my instrument home..." is NOT an excuse!

Parent Initials- When you are practicing at home, your parents should initial next to your practice session once you have completed your practice log.

Your Completed Practice Log is worth 10% of your mark overall. You will be required to hand in your completed practice log at the end of each month.
